Gingerbread Houses Grade 3 Watercolor/Markers Objective:

Students will view and discuss why the houses of the Victorian period were called Gingerbread Houses. While learning about this style of Architecture, students discovered the three characteristics of a Gingerbread House;

- 1. Front porches
- 2. Painted using 3 or 4 colors
- 3. Decorations for trimmings and shingles
- 4. Symmetry

Students will create and illustrate a Gingerbread House using pencils, markers and watercolor paint showing the four characteristics found in this particular architectural style.

Resources:

Teacher Created Slideshow of the Gingerbread Houses at OakBluff on Martha's Vineyard

Student and Teacher Activities:

Day 1 and 2:

Students will view teacher created slideshow of the Gingerbread Houses at OakBluff – then discuss what the characteristics may be of these particular houses.

Students will follow step-by-step instruction on creating the basic structure of the house – using ruler to create square bottom and triangle top.

Students will begin to add the various details (windows, doors, shingles, decorations and etc.) using pencil – Once they have completed their pencil drawing, the students will use sharpies to go over the lines.

Day 2:

Teacher will demonstrate technique of using watercolor paint to prepare the students for Day 3. Day 3:

Students will begin to use Watercolor paint – keeping in mind the techniques demonstrated the previous day – and only using 3-4 colors on the house inself.

Day 4:

Finish watercolor painting.

Orally critique their projects – review.
